


THE APOSTLE PETER AND THE GRACE REVOLUTION






Matthew 15:3, 6b NIV

Matthew 10:34-36 AMP






"Men and brethren, sons of the family of Abraham, and those among you who fear God, to you the word of this salvation has been sent."






Acts 10:9-14 NIV



"The voice spoke to him a second time, "Do not call anything impure that God has made clean." This happened three times, and immediately the sheet was taken back to heaven."






