Just a moment to confirm the reliability of the Bible itself

Earliest copy of other docs



Usually scrolls are hundreds or even 1,000 years later

The New Testament

 Earliest copy just 25 years later and some parts very early.

The number of copies:

A purer form than any other great book—99.5% is beyond any doubt.

- Usually between 8 & 49
 The New Testament
 - 24,000 copies in 3 translations

How do we know the date of a scroll?

- Copperplate writing was taught till the 80's
- It was replaced by Queensland Cursive
- The different style gives the clue to the date:



abcdefghijklmn opgrstuvuxyz

The Greek writing style in John's gospel fragment was not used after 125, so we can date it, very early



Info from writers outside the Bible

Apart from the gospels, we know that, Jesus was:


- A Jewish teacher
- Performed healings and exorcisms
- Believed to be the Messiah
- Rejected by Jewish leaders
- Crucified under Pontius Pilate
- His followers believed He came back to life
- News had spread to Rome by 64.
- All classes followed him—men & women, slave & free, rich & poor.
- They worshipped him as God





Thallus 52 CE & Phlegon 137 CE

it became night in the 6th hour of the day (noon)...
Stars appeared and a great earthquake...



Both explain the darkness at Easter time as an eclipse of the sun.

(This was impossible at Passover time, but it does confirm the black darkness & date).

History of Latter Han Dynasty, volume 1, Chronicles of Emperor Gaung Wu, 7th year

In the day of Gui Hai, the last day of the month, there was a solar eclipse (The Emperor) proclaimed,

Man from heaven died

"Yin and Yang have mistakenly switched, and the sun and moon were eclipsed.



(The Emperor) proclaims pardon to all under heaven."

Let's apply the same skills to The death of Jesus



His death by crucifixion is well attested

The final hours of Jesus

The Master because Mastered.
 Gethsemane—often there/pray



We see His:

- (a) courage in submitting to the Father's will
- (b) authority (garden, trials, cross);
- (c) obedience fulfilling Scripture (Phil 2:6-11);
- (d) protective love (Judas, the disciples, His mum)
- (e) trust in God's sovereignty
- (f) Ok to ask 'why'
- (g) triumph It is finished!



Being Sure



The resurrection is the central fact of the Christian faith

If it's untrue the rest collapses

History is not tested by a repeat (impossible)...

We establish by the "legal method"—
beyond reasonable doubt.

We look for evidence such as:



- Exhibits—a weapon, wreckage, the victim's body, a photo, Finger prints, documents,
- Testimonies— "I was there & I saw..."

Then we test these to see if they stack up!



The resurrection is the most verifiable event in all of world history

The mystery question...


What could have happened to Jesus' body?

- Jews or Romans might have hidden it
- Grave robbers might have stolen it.
- > Did the women go to the wrong tomb?
- Were the appearances hallucinations?
- The disciples might have stolen it while the guards were asleep
- 'Swoon' theory
- He really did return to life...





Maybe Jews or Romans hid it



They were angry when the disciples preached the resurrection

Producing the body would have proven He was still dead.

Grave robbers might have stolen it.



- 18 armed guards on duty.
- The emperor's seal on the cement!

Superstition of a miracle worker claiming to be divine would have also been a deterrent to their dozing off.

Did the women go to the wrong tomb?

- They <u>saw</u> Jesus' body placed in the garden tomb.
- They went & told the disciples who ran to the tomb to check.
- The Romans would also have gone to the correct tomb



Were the appearances hallucinations?

More than 500 witnesses is impressive, but...Maybe it was a hallucination.

But,

- A hallucination is not a group thing
- His followers weren't expecting Him to rise and it can't be imposed.
- It means the body would still have been in the tomb

The disciples might have stolen it while the guards were asleep


- 'Sleeping guards' doesn't fit their discipline
- If stolen why didn't the Jewish authorities press charges?
- The disciples sealed their belief in resurrection by dying martyrs deaths



Nobody dies for a lie

Swoon' theory—He wasn't dead

- Jesus had been flogged unmercifully by troops
- The crown of thorns—He would have lost blood
- He'd had nothing to drink
- Carrying the cross was exhausting
- The huge nails in hands & feet were excruciating
- The spear in His side pierced the heart



It doesn't begin to fit the facts

There's more...

- The Romans knew when a victim was dead
- The people bandaging the body would have noticed if He was breathing

yet...



It fits the facts even less!

Can you believe?... there's still more!

He would need to

- revive, <u>unaided</u> in the tomb
- Remove the bandages
- Find the door in the darkness
- Push over the 2 tonne rock
- Rush out & convince the guards & disciples that He was risen when...
- His serious injuries made Him need intensive care at the hospital






It <u>really</u> doesn't fit the facts

He really did return to life...

This is the <u>only</u> explanation that does fit the facts

Over 1900 years since believers have confirmed that He's alive

Jesus enemies did us a favour by setting a guard. We can be sure.
