





Timeline of Haggai

In the second year of King Darius, in the sixth month, on the first day of the month, the word of the LORD came by Haggai the prophet to Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, saying,

12: Then Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, and Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, with all the remnant of the people, obeyed the voice of the LORD their God, and the words of Haggai the prophet, as the LORD their God had sent him; and the people feared the presence of the LORD. Then Haggai, the LORD's messenger, spoke the LORD's message to the people, saying, "<u>I am with you, says the</u> LORD."

So the LORD stirred up the spirit of Zerubbabel, governor of Judah, and the spirit of Joshua the high priest, and the spirit of all the remnant of the people; and they came and worked on the house of the LORD of hosts, their God, on the twentyfourth day of the sixth month, in the second year of King Darius.

Haggai – Prophet

Zerubbabel - Governor of Judah. Appointed by King Darius. His name means 'seed of Babylon'. His father, Shealtiel - tracing the lineage back shows that he is of the Royal line of David.

Joshua – High Priest. He had been taken into captivity in Babylon and now served as high priest to the returning community.

Joshua – Priest

Zerubbabel - Politician - Governor of Judah.


