

Haggai 2 v1-9

Does it not seem to you <u>like nothing</u> in comparison?



Zechariah 4:10a 'Do not despise these small beginnings for the Lord rejoices to see the work begin' – Zechariah was reminding the Jews that the rebuilding of the small temple was 'no small thing' in God's eyes.






