Mark 11:12-15 & 20-24 (NKJV)

12 Now the next day, when they had come out from Bethany, He was hungry.

13 And seeing from afar a fig tree having leaves, He went to see if perhaps He would find something on it. When He came to it, He found nothing but leaves, for it was not the season for figs. 14 In response Jesus said to it, "Let no one eat fruit from you ever again." And His disciples heard it. 15 So they came to Jerusalem. Then Jesus went into the temple and began to drive out those who bought and sold in the temple, and overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who sold doves.

20 Now in the morning, as they passed by, they saw the fig tree dried up from the roots.

21 And Peter, remembering, said to Him, "Rabbi, look! The fig tree which You cursed has withered away." 22 So Jesus answered and said to them, "Have faith in God.

23 For assuredly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be removed and be cast into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says. 24 Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them."

Hebrews 11:3 (NKJV)


“By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.”

“And these signs will follow those who believe: In My name they will cast out demons; they will speak with new tongues;


18 they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.”

having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; 16 above all, taking the shield of faith with

which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. 17 And take the helmet of salvation,

and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; 18 praying always with all prayer and supplication in

the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints.”

Mark 16:17-18 (NKJV)

:: Spiritual warfare – weapons of warfare

- Casting out demons: You have authority over spiritual darkness.**
- Speaking in tongues: You’re empowered to connect with God supernaturally .**
- Taking up serpents: You can identify lies and declare GODs promises over them.**
- Drink anything deadly: Your heart stays rooted in truth – Gods word -Jesus' resurrection life.**
- Healing the sick: You bring restoration to others through Christ’s power .**
